U.S.-Flag Lakers' Cargo Up 5-plus Percent in July

CLEVELAND—U.S.-flag Great Lakes freighters ("lakers") carried 11.1 million tons of dry-bulk cargo in July, an increase of 10.9 percent compared to June, and an increase of 5.2 percent compared to a year ago. The July "float" was also 2.1 percent above the month's 5-year average.

Iron ore cargos for the steel industry increased 17 percent compared to a year ago, but coal for power generation and steel production fell by 11.4 percent. Aggregate and fluxstone for the construction and steel industries slipped by 3.8 percent.

Through July U.S.-flag cargos stand at 44.8 million tons, an increase of 3 percent compared to the same point in 2010. Iron ore has increased 9.6 percent, but coal and limestone are down by 5.1 percent and 4.6 percent respectively.

Compared to the 5-year average for the first seven months of the year, U.S.-flag cargos are down 2.1 percent.

Lake Carriers' Association represents 17 American companies that operate 55 U.S.-flag vessels on the Great Lakes that carry the raw materials that drive the nation's economy: iron ore and fluxstone for the steel industry, aggregate and cement for the construction industry, coal for power generation....
